

Movie Review of Don Jon

For a movie labelled a romantic comedy, Don Jon, stood out to me in several ways from other movies of the same genre. Whereas I often feel that romantic comedies lack a compelling story, Don Jon had a refreshingly new tone to the plot. In addition, the movie sticks to its main character, and the main character's personal development as the driving force of the movie, instead of relying on the desire for happiness to be the motivation for the protagonist. And the topics. Don Jon dares to bring up topics related to relationships that other movies avoid such as: masturbation i.e. to "do-it-yourself", porn addiction, and how relationships are formed by stereotypes from different medias. In short, Don Jon thereby becomes a looking-glass into our own lives and aspects of relationships that can be hard to explore single-handily.

Don Jon, Joseph Gordon Levitt's editorial debut, centres around Don Martello, a catholic New Jersey inhabitant, womanizer, and porn addict that "does-it-himself" more often than you would care to know. When Don on a night out with friends meets Barbara, a good-looking blonde played by Scarlett Johansson, Don starts to transform from his womanizer-self to become the boyfriend Barbara expects him to be, which involves going back to school, change of personal habits and a greater involvement of family and friends in their relationship. Without seemingly a word, but with a small bitterness building up inside, Don obliges all Barbara's demands. Except one. When Barbara catches Don watching pornography, she is outraged and disgusted. Desperate to stop the fighting, Don lies to Barbara, saying that the video had been sent to him in an email by a friend as a prank. The lie puts Don in a troublesome position, where his addiction to pornography hinders him from seeing Barbara's point of view and from wanting to make a change. Quitting never becomes a reality, Don only starts to find outlets for his addiction, at places more and less suitable.



As Don takes up school once again through night classes, he meets Esther, a widow who recently lost her son and husband. A weird couple of interactions, the first where Don catches Esther crying during break, and the second being Esther catching Don watching porn in class on his cell phone, give rise to interesting relationship that helps Don grow beyond the façade of change that he put up for Barbara. Esther plays a major part in setting the tone for the ending of the movie. For a movie with the tagline "Everyone wants a happy ending", the finale part of the movie left a bittersweet tone rather than joyous. Even though the ending felt abrupt; the tone the movie set made Don Jon a worthwhile watch.

Don Jon's game changer compared to other romantic comedies is that what plays out on screen is Joseph Gordon Levitt's reflection on how men and women's views of relationships are affected by what media outlets we watch. Don Jon interestingly points out how aspects as one's relationship with pornography can skew one's view of what a relationship can offer.

However, simultaneously Don Jon also addressed how less-taboo media outlets as romantic movies and magazine can build up destructive expectations just as easily.

A tone of bitterness to the end, a great watch, and a story which manages to convey deeper reflections on how we are affected by what we watch. Other movie reviewers might have given an A to Don Jon, and therefore I will not be worse, and Don Jon receives a 11.63 on the pH scale, which is roughly the pH for 1.0 mol/dm³ of A, ammonia.

Don Jon had an interesting take on romantic comedies, as it plays out from the view of an adult movie addicted tough guy.

What I liked about the movie:

- The ending was good, a different twist to the happy endings that usually take place in romantic comedies.
- The theme was interesting and brought up thoughts on trust, porn addiction, and hypocrisy in relationships.

- The comedy was never immensely funny. The comedy worked at occasions, but the concept/story of the movie carried it, not the comedy.

Druiden's guide to boatbuilding

My section at the carnival went on a cruise on our kick-off. It was a real blast until I got seasick, which left me lying on the floor for the greater part of that Sunday. A lot went through my mind during the close to ten hours I spent there. After questioning my every life choice in a fruitless attempt to find a way to end my suffering, listening to every half-decent song on my phone and attempting to stand up twice, I got a seemingly perfect idea for an article. I should make a boatbuilding tutorial in case any of our readers would like to try the very efficient weight loss method I was experiencing in that very moment.

The basics of the boat is to make use of a hollow waterproof vessel that utilizes Archimedes' principle to push off enough water to keep it afloat. The traditional material used is wood, due to its low density yet relatively good ability to prevent leakage, especially if the surface is treated with a waterproof chemical of the builder's choice. However, you need to be aware if the wood is prone to rotting. Oak is usually a safe bet, and one tree is more than enough to build a skiff (eka, jolle), which is what we will be building.

When you have decided on which tree to use, it is time carve planks and construct the vehicle. But let's face it, you're not going to cut down a tree, so you're using plywood, which is a surprisingly good material and easy to shape. You need to treat the surface though. There are many ways to design the frame, but I would not recommend using the classic shipbuilding technique. In shipbuilding, you usually craft a keel, and go from there. But for those who aren't experienced in the art of shipbuilding, it is a quite difficult task to craft even a mediocre one.

Therefore, I recommend beginning with a set of evenly thick planks, which you align into a wooden floor and cut into your favourite boat shape. You need to create walls as well. This is quite the challenge, but plywood is like previously stated easy to shape. This makes simplifies cutting the plywood sheets into smaller pieces in order to create walls of adequate height that you can mold to fit your previously crafted floor. Use nails and glue to make the parts fit together, and voila, you have a great start.



We need some final touches to turn our joined pieces of plywood into a boat after creating the main frame. A rudder and a centreboard are absolutely necessary. The rudder is a plank on the rear, mainly under water, which you can angle about 180 degrees in order to steer the boat, and the centreboard is a thin piece of wood attached to the bottom of the boat, which stabilizes it. The boat won't move by itself, so we need a way to make it useful. Sails are awesome, but I have nothing remotely close to an idea of how they are properly constructed. But I do know how oars work. Create two loops and nail them onto the top of the skiff's walls, put oars in them and you're good to go. A good idea could be to create a sitting plank in the boat first, so you can be sure that the oars will be placed in a position where they are ergonomic to use. It tends to be easier to accomplish in that order.

Ta-da! The boat is completed! Uppdragsphadders for the regatta: I'm handing over the relay stick, you know what to do.



Flower time

The spring is finally here, the sun shines through my not so clean window and I realize my winter decoration is still there. The cut out snowflakes that have been hanging from my curtain rod since December must away. But what am I going to hang up there instead? I know: flowers. They can stay at my window until winter, so there won't be any need to change the decoration in some months. Perfect!

I've decided to make origami flowers, and here's a description of how to make them if you too feel the need to decorate your room.


Follow the descriptions on pictures a) to f):

- a) Start with a square paper. Fold it diagonally and then turn it around. Fold it in the middle. Fold down all three corners to the fourth. (It's easier than it sounds/looks like).
- b) Fold the first layer of paper in the square as in the picture. In 10, carefully fold up the first layer until it looks like 11. Then turn the paper and do the steps 7-11 on the other side.
- c) Fold up the first layer as in 12, and then fold the paper so that the back meets the back as in 13. Fold up the first layer so that it's pointing directly towards you.

Extend the gap as in 15 and press it to make it flat. It should now look like 16. Turn the paper and do the steps 14-15 on the other side. When you're done, fold it up.


- d) Fold the four tips to the middle and turn it around. Put up the small first layer so it points towards you.
- e) Extend the gaps on each side of the layer and put the folded paper in your hand. Put one finger tip in each of the four gaps, and twirl the form until it looks like 23. If needed, use glue to make the rose stay as it is.
- f) And... you're done!




